Gentlemen:-

The undersigned are residents of Plandome Manor Village who signed the petition requesting the officials to enforce the Village Ordinance prohibiting the use of streets, particularly on Circle Drive at or near the village parcel for parking or loitering of automobiles and requesting that "No Parking" signs be erected thereat. We understand that the petition was presented to the Board of Trustees at the meeting in June, and to date no action has been taken thereon.

Since the petition was presented, automobiles not only periodically continue to violate this ordinance, but on four occasions a car owned and operated by Mrs. Johnson, wife of our Street Commissioner, actually parked her car in the village parcel. We understand that when the petition was presented, our representative advised the Board that we were strongly opposed to the use of the village parcel for parking.

It appears that not only has the Board failed to act upon our petition, but either unofficially acquiesced or gave permission to certain residents to park in the village parcel. Such continued action is in utter disregard of the contrary to the expressed request of the residents who signed the petition and violates our Village laws and Ordinances. We believe that these Village officials have no legal right or authority to give permission to certain residents or others to park on or at the village parcel or any other parcel of street in our Village.

We therefore ask that one or two spokesmen of our group be permitted to be heard on these matters at the next meeting of the Board of Trustees.

If such permission is granted, we would ask that you advise of the date and time of such meeting.
